- Excavate and document excavation units as components of archaeological evaluation and data recovery projects.
- Participate in additional projects as appropriate according to skill level, experience, and ability.

Requirements

- B.A. or B.S. degree in archaeology, anthropology, or closely related field.
- Archaeological field school or demonstrated equivalent experience.
- Ability to maintain steady pace while accurately recording archaeological observations and artifact collection.
- Ability to work efficiently in adverse environmental conditions, including hot and cold temperatures, precipitation, and challenging terrain for sustained durations.
- Archaeological knowledge of the precontact and post-contact periods, including ability to recognize and preliminarily identify regional artifacts.
- Ability to work individually and as a team.
